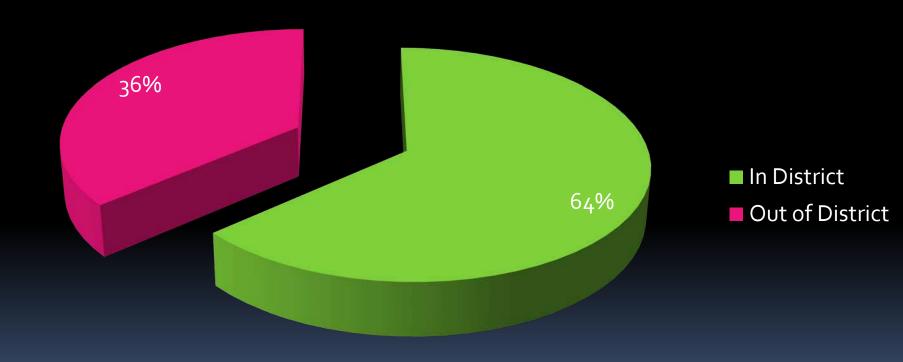

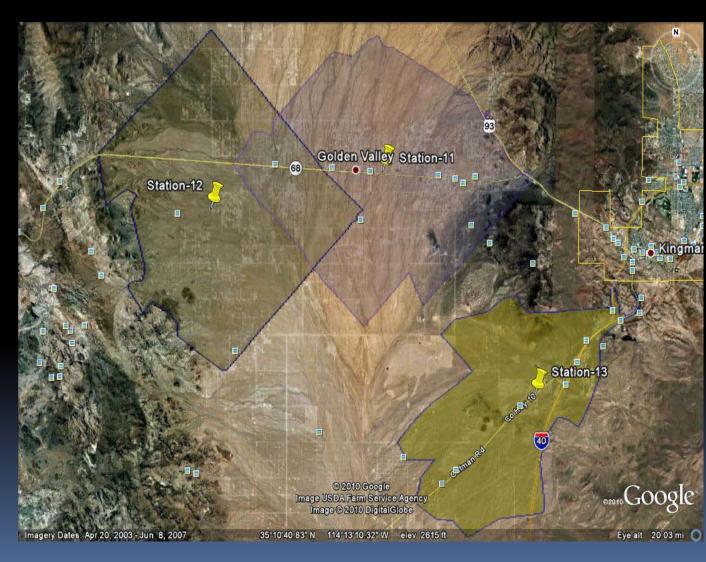
# Golden Valley Fire District Fire Station Construction workshop

- And most importantly: utilizing funds that have been setaside for new construction

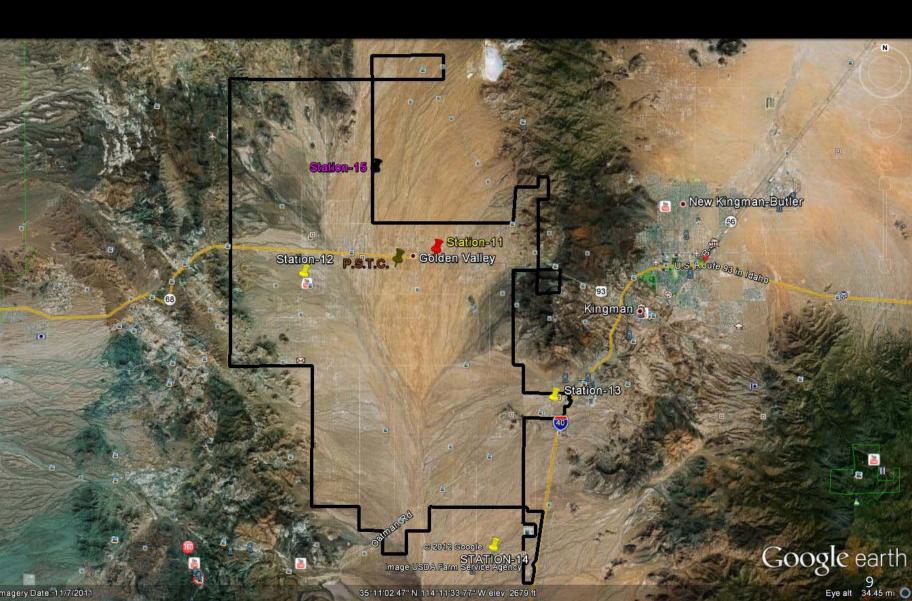

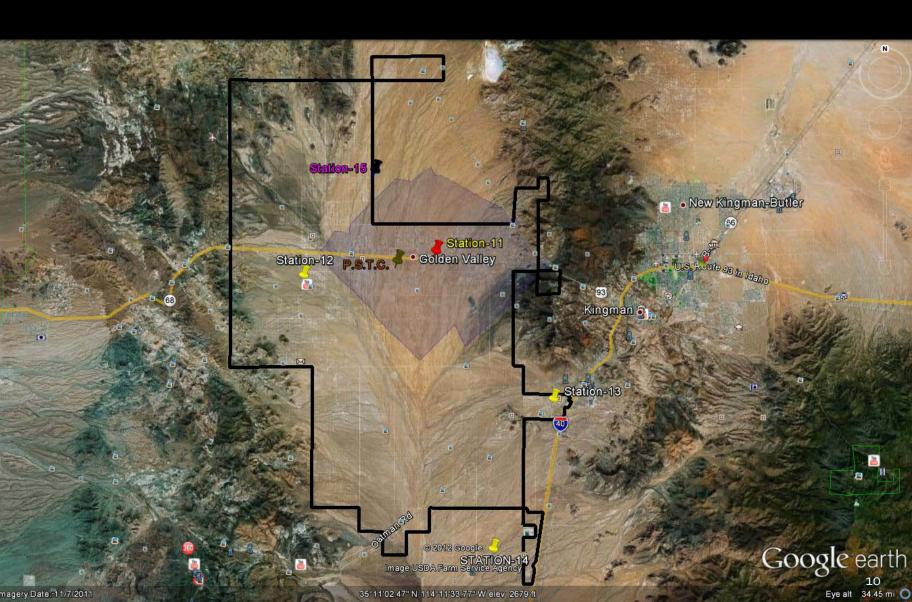

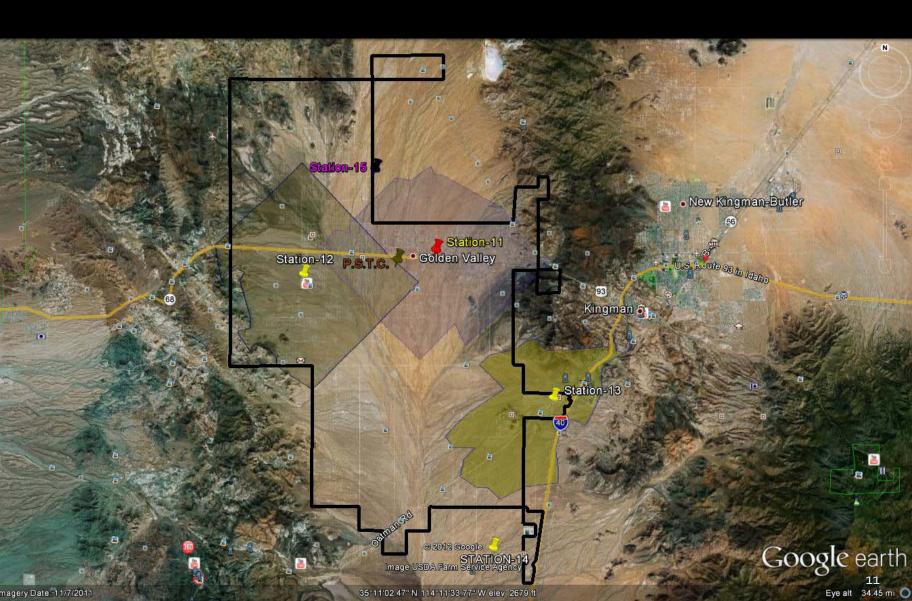
# Current Fire District boundary

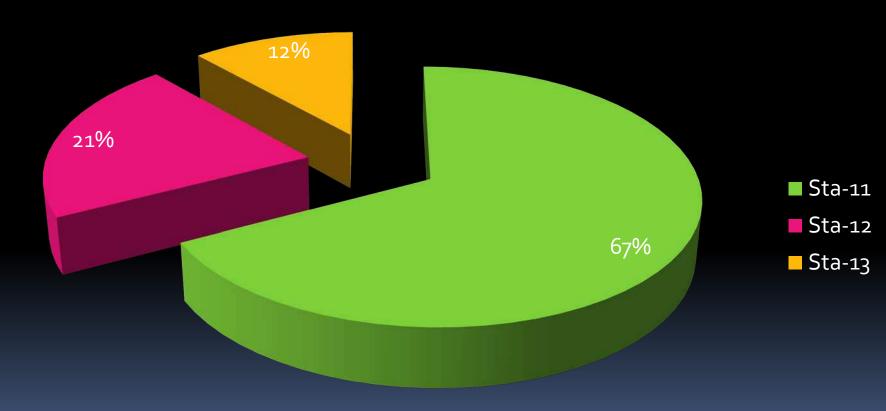

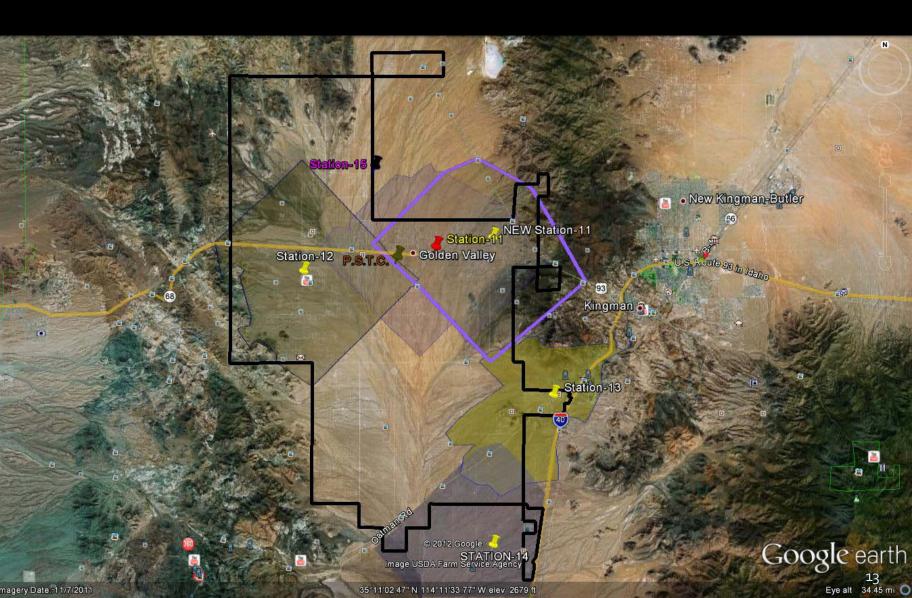

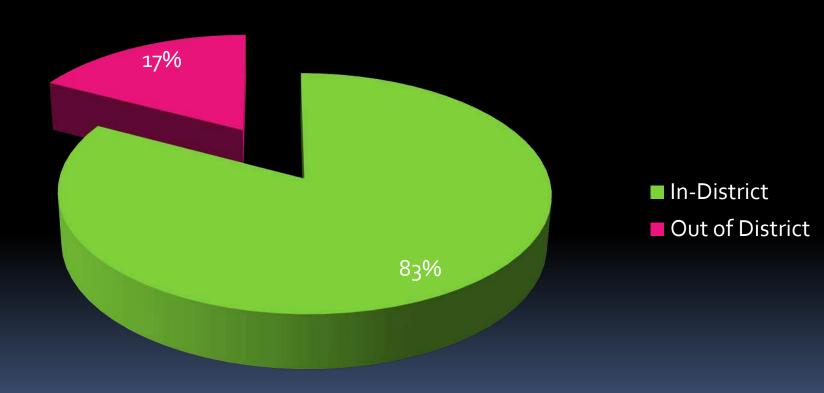
Call Percentage Average for current three Stations



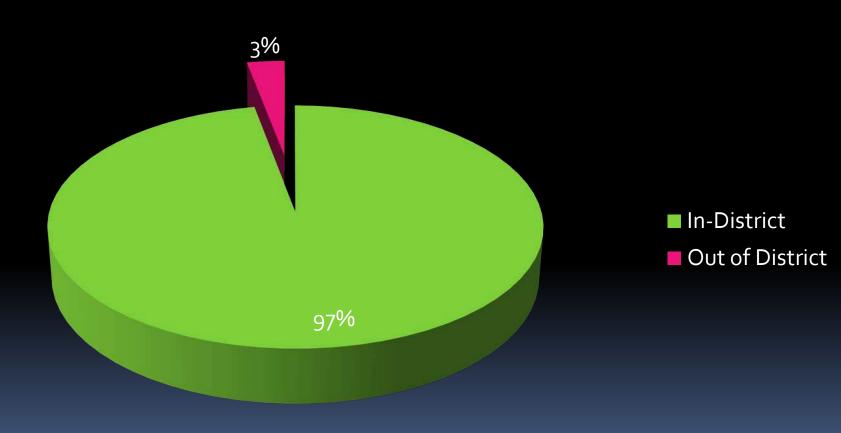

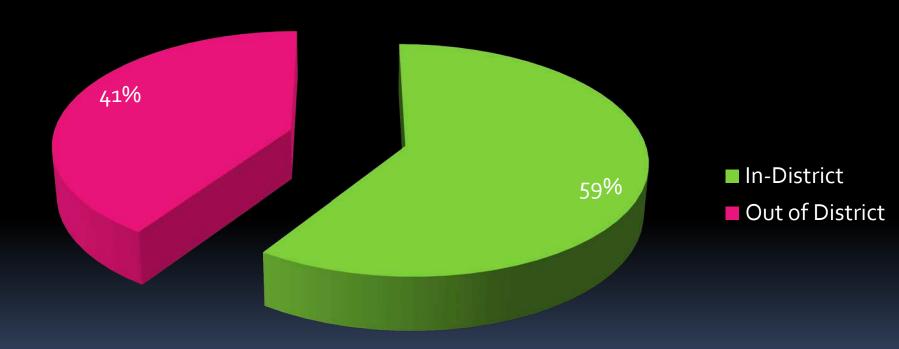
#### Station-11 geographic coverage



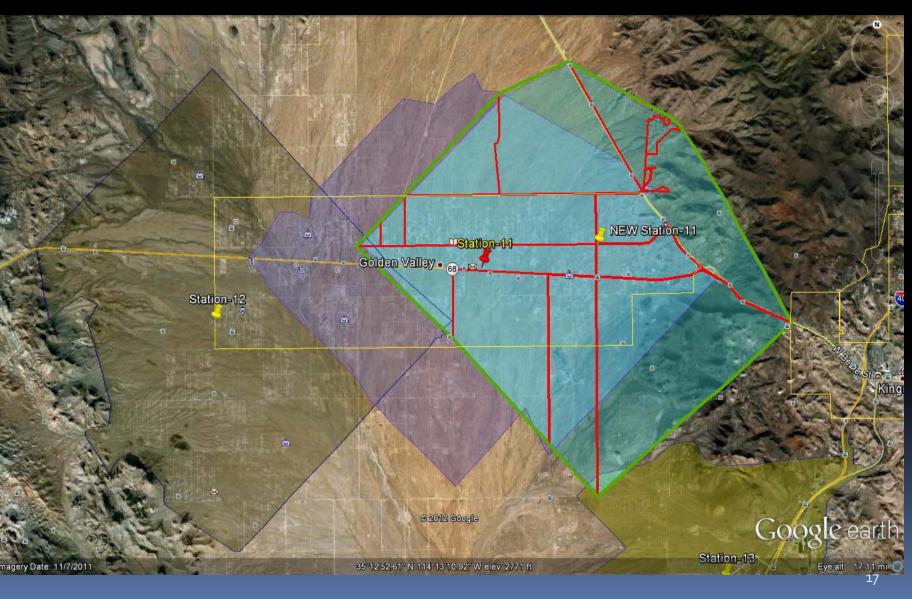

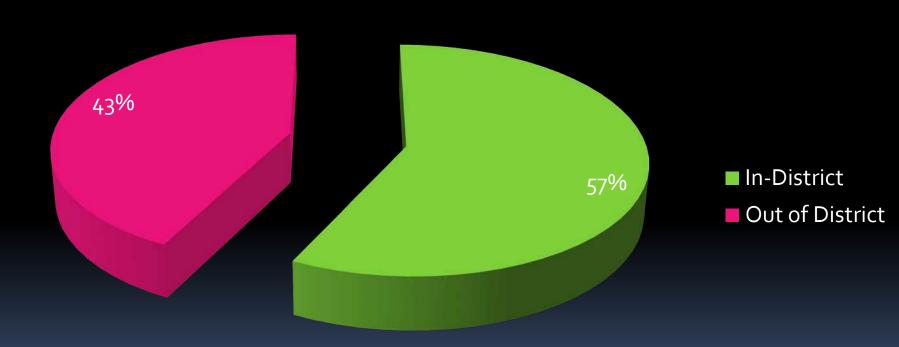

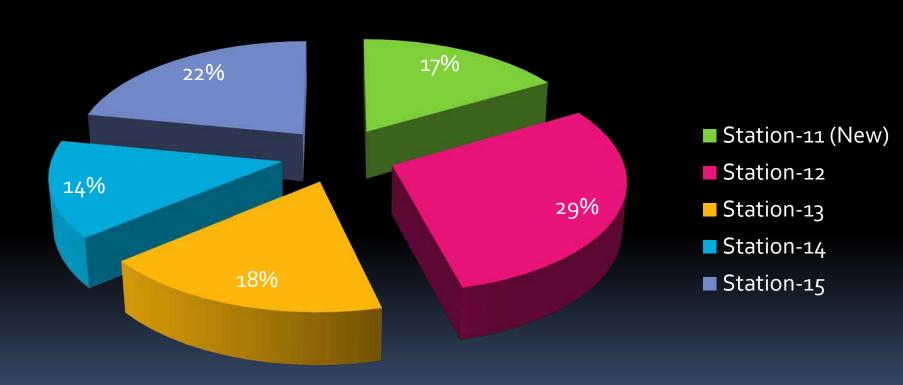

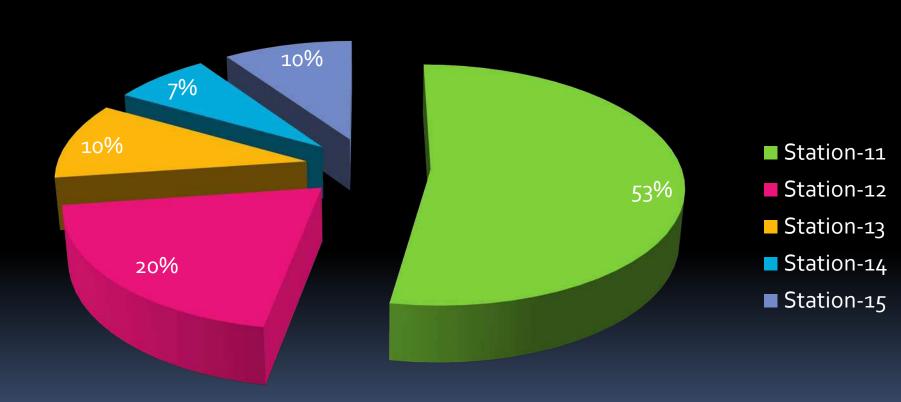
## Division of Parcels per station

#### Approximate <u>Parcels</u> of 5-mile radius for each station

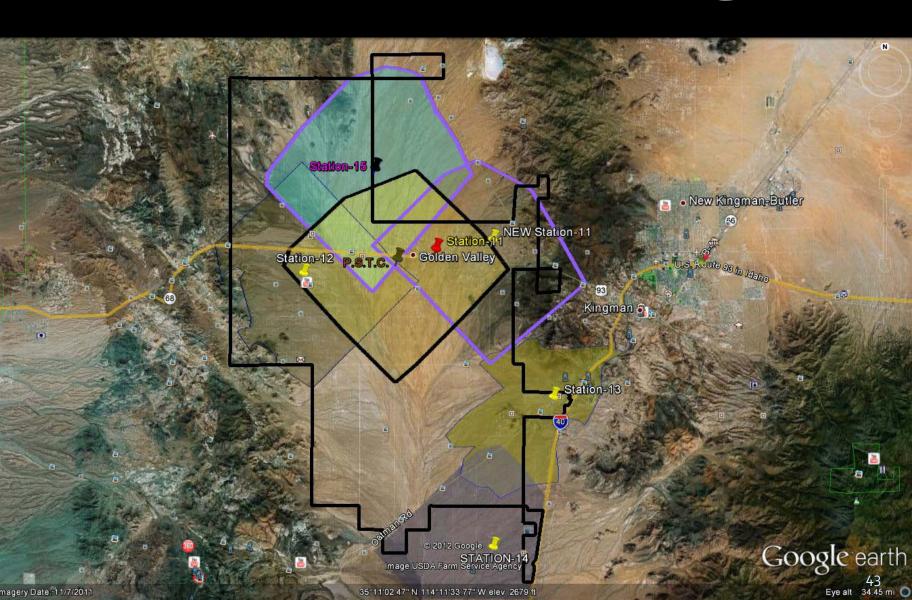


## Division of incidents per station

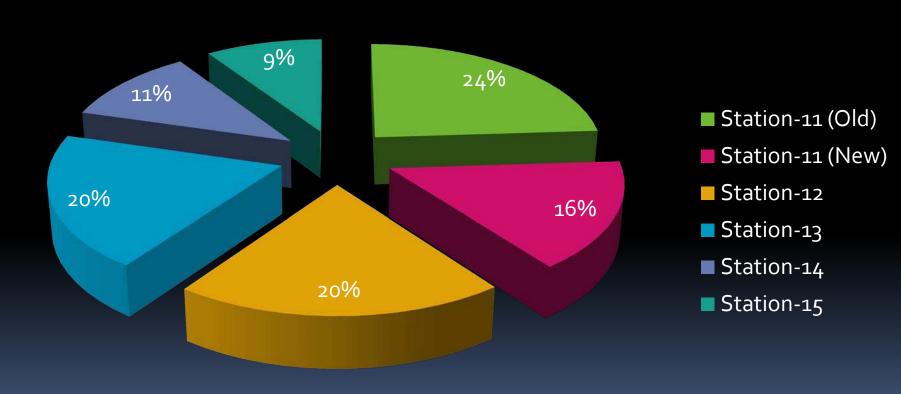

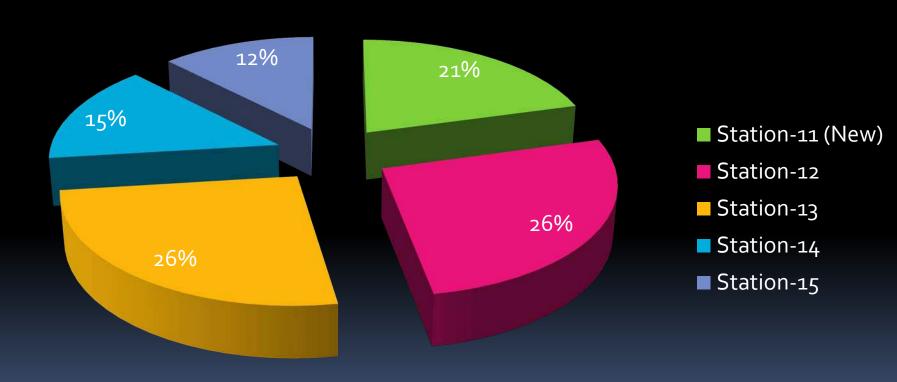
## Division of Full Cash Values

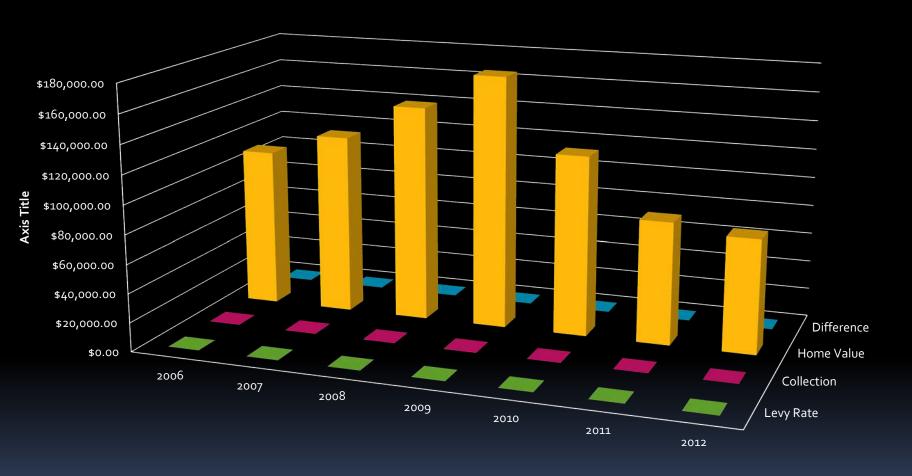

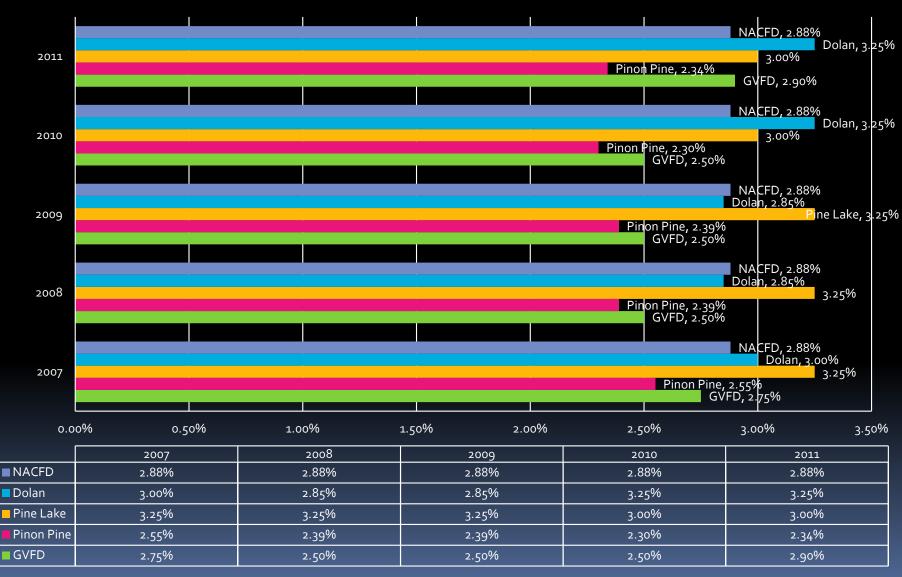

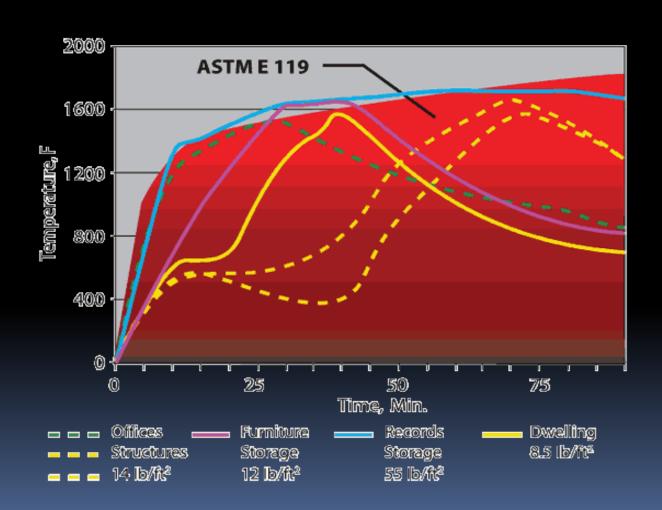

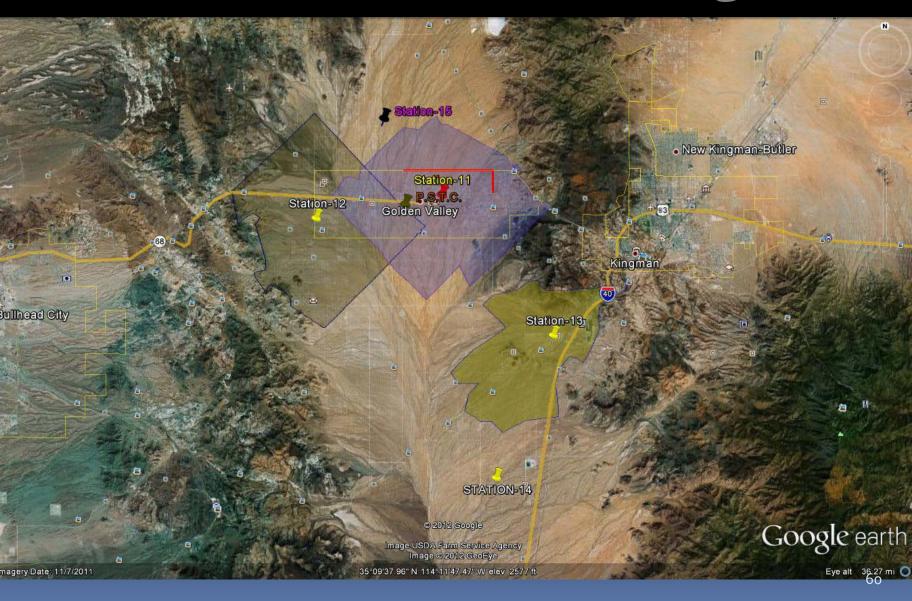
